Congratulations

Rev. Dr. Nicholas Hopman - on the completion of your PhD in Philosophy!

Scripture often talks about feeding and eating. On Easter, we read the prophet I Isaiah's promises about the



feast to come (Isaiah 25:6-10). The kingdom of God will not be a place where disembodied souls are floating around or doing whatever disembodied souls might do. Instead, as the Apostles Creed states, we believe in the resurrection of the body. And Isaiah promises us that heaven will be like a Thanksgiving feast.

We have also recently (Fourth Sunday of Easter, April 21st) read Christ's preaching that he is our good shepherd (John 10:11-18), which is paired in the lectionary with Psalm 23. The shepherd's two main roles are to protect the sheep and to feed the sheep. Psalm 23's reference to "green pastures" is a reference to feeding. Sheep eat grass.

Scripture's many discussions of feeding and eating should also help us understand our lives as Christians. Often the Christian faith is described as a kind of ladder. Christians, we are told, are to become more mature over time. The Christian life is depicted as if we are students, constantly advancing to the next higher grade or degree program. There is some truth in this way of thinking. Confirmation students can learn about God's word in a way that they could not in the first years of Sunday School. Adults generally have a better perspective on the trials and temptations of life than children do. I'm sure that the elderly understand certain things better than middle-aged people.

However, we should not quickly map the stages of human maturity onto our understanding of being a Christian. The biggest warning against this comes from Christ himself when he tells us that the kingdom of heaven is for children. "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven (Matthew 18:3)."

Christ is not encouraging immaturity here. He is encouraging the great faith with which children trust God. But this certainly indicates that the Christian life is not equivalent with the process of human maturing through ageing or training. Whatever we learn about Scripture and faith as we grow in years, whatever maturity we gain, Christ tells us that this is all for the sake of holding onto childlike faith.

Better than viewing the Christian life as a ladder, we should learn from Scripture's pronouncements about eating. After we're able to eat solid food, we do not improve much at eating for the rest of our lives. Eating is a daily activity. Mealtime is a time for prayer, not just for Christians, as human beings thank God for what he has provided. Eating must be daily repeated. If you have a lot of free time on Tuesday, you can't eat all the food on Tuesday that you'll need for the rest of the week. Eating doesn't work that way. We are in need of food every day. We never graduate from that need or move onto a higher level of eating.

In the same way, the Christian life is a constant feeding on Christ's word. Some days we eat more than others, but we will always be hungry again. We never increase in wisdom or maturity to the point that we don't need Christ's forgiveness every day. Christ feeds us with his word, week by week, day by day, until we rest in his peace. He will then call us into his kingdom, where we will feast with him and all the saints in joy, but never again need to be fed with the forgiveness of our sins.
